• Soft Shield-fern <i>Polystichum setiferum</i>	2 x pinnate	GL CF
• Bracken <i>Pteridium aquilinum</i>	3 x pinnate	CF
• Scaly Male Fern <i>Dryopteris affinis</i>	2 x pinnate	CF
• Borrer's Male Fern <i>Dryopteris borrieri</i>	2 x pinnate	CF
• Wall Rue <i>Asplenium ruta-muraria</i>	2 x pinnate	Walls
• Maidenhair Spleenwort <i>Asplenium trichomanes</i>	1 x pinnate	Walls
• Polypody <i>Polypodium vulgare</i> agg	1 x pinnate	GL
• Black Spleenwort <i>Asplenium diantum-nigrum</i>	2 x pinnate	Walls
• Hard Shield-fern <i>Polystichum aculeatum</i>	2 x pinnate	GL
• Water Fern <i>Azolla filiculoides</i>	Undivided	Water
• Lady Fern <i>Athyrium filix-femina</i>	2 x pinnate	CF
• Adder's-tongue <i>Ophioglossum vulgatum</i>	Undivided	Wilwell
• Rustyback <i>Asplenium ceterach</i>	1 x pinnate	Stanford
• Limestone Fern <i>Gymnocarpium robertianum</i>	3 x pinnate	Tollerton
• House Holly Fern <i>Cyrtomium falcatum</i>	1 x pinnate	GL

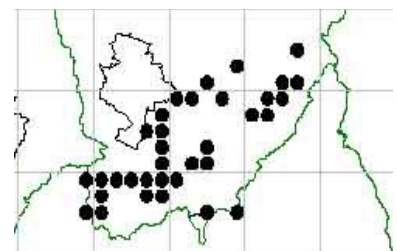
